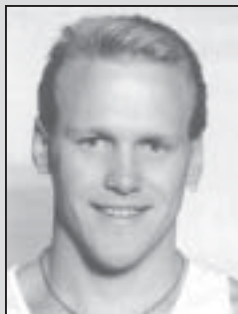

EIU TRACK & FIELD FACILITIES

The Panther track and field team competes both indoors and outdoors in two of the finest facilities in the Midwest.

O'Brien Stadium, a 10,000 seat venue, has a new state-of-the-art Panther blue full pour polyurethane all-weather track. Besides the nine lane track, the new surface also includes two long jump and triple jump runways, two pole vault pits, and a high jump area.

The stadium is the site of the annual Illinois High School Association Girls and Boys State Track Championships. Over 4000 competitors and 20,000 spectators come to EIU each May for these state meets. The girls championship has been held at EIU every year since its inception in 1973. The boys meet has been a fixture at O'Brien Stadium since 1974.

Adjacent to the stadium is 600 seat Lantz Fieldhouse which houses the indoor track facility. In January, 2001 a new Mondo X track surface was installed in alternating Blue and Gray lanes. A new Daktronics message and scoreboard was added to record times, distances and team scores.

The Panthers have hosted the Ohio Valley Conference Indoor Track & Field Championship in 1997, 1999, 2001, and 2002. The OVC outdoor meet was held at the stadium in 1997.

PRESIDENT HENCKEN



Louis V. Hencken, who has served Eastern in a variety of administrative positions for over 35 years, is in his second year as President.

He was appointed Interim on August 1, 2001 and will continue in that capacity until July 1, 2004.

Under his leadership this past year, significant progress was made with an increase in University enrollment. Also, the completion of two major capital development projects, the newly constructed Martin Luther King University Union Food Court and the renovation of Booth Library, enhanced the quality of student life and academic support.

Hencken began his career in student affairs at EIU as a graduate assistant and advanced through the housing ranks as a counselor and both assistant and associate director prior to being selected director in 1975.

In 1989, he was named Associate Vice President for Student Affairs, assuming responsibility for three new student affairs areas besides housing.

In 1996-97 he served as interim Director of Athletics. He is a former NCAA football official and was assigned to five NCAA playoff games including the 1989 NCAA Division III National Championship game.

Hencken has been president of the Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center board of directors for the past five years and has also served on the Credit Union 1 board of directors. Two years ago he was named Southwestern Illinois College's Outstanding Alumnus.

He and his wife, Mary Kay, reside in Charleston.

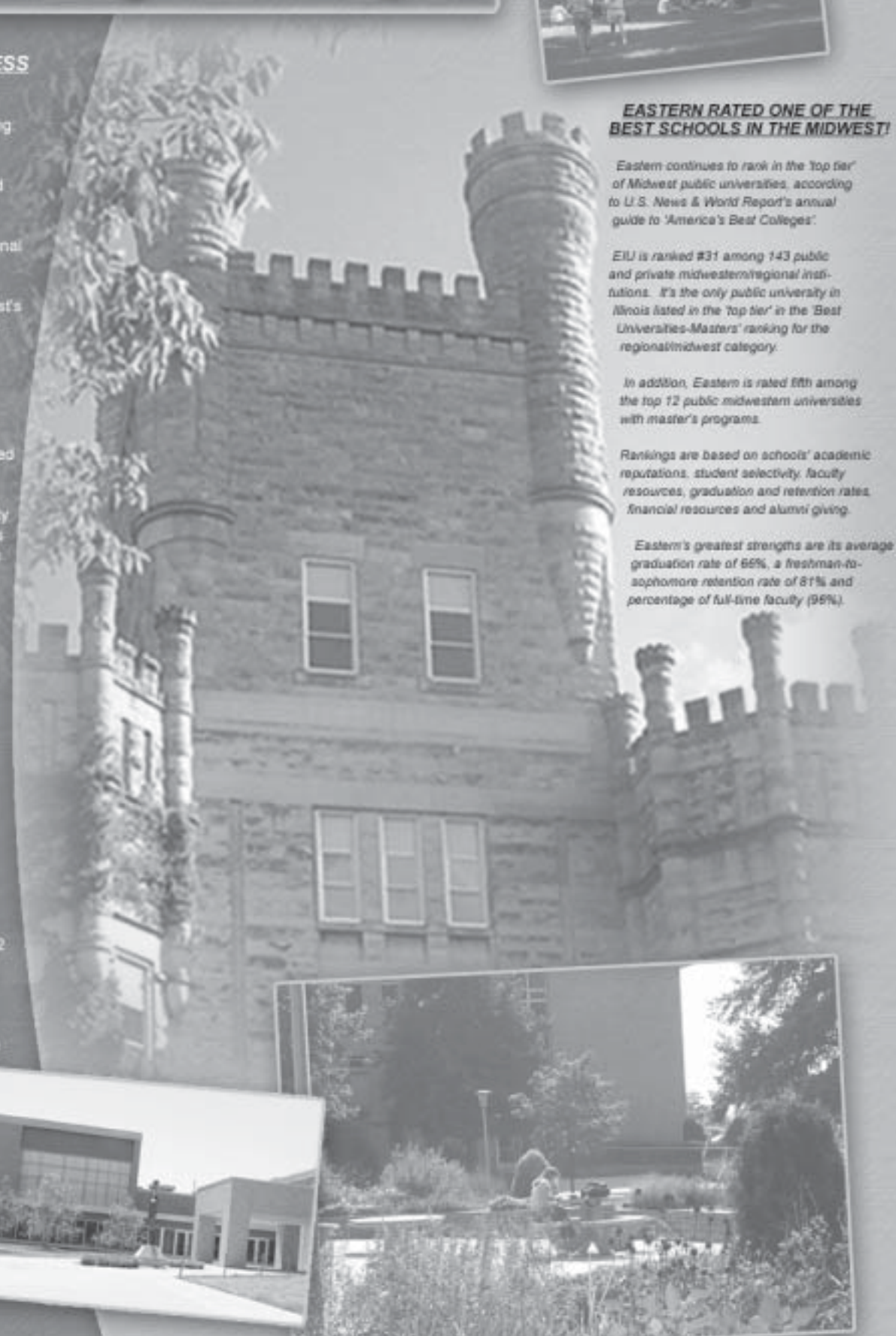
Eastern continues to rank in the 'top tier' of Midwest public universities, according to U.S. News & World Report's annual guide to 'America's Best Colleges'.
